Accelerated Degrees: What are they?



- A GREAT RECRUITMENT TOOL!
- Qualified IUPUI undergrads can earn a bachelor's degree AND a master's degree in a shorter timeframe than if pursued independently (i.e. 5 years vs. 6 years)
- A set number of credits apply to both undergraduate and graduate requirements.
- Approved IUPUI accelerated degree programs are found

Accelerated Degrees: How do they work?

- **4 years UGRAD + 1 year GRAD model (aka 4+1 programs)**
 - Allows for maximum financial aid eligibility.
 - Students take graduate courses in their 4th year, and finish graduate plan of study in year 5 **AFTER** being admitted to master's program.
- **Internal school application (or declaration of intent)**
 - No later than 3rd year of study*
 - Student is placed in BS/MS program plan code in SIS by school recorder.**
- **Graduate application for the admit term AFTER undergrad degree is awarded**
 - Example: complete IU Graduate CAS application summer 2020 (for spring 2021 admit term), undergrad degree awarded fall 2020, start grad program spring 2021

*some programs recruit direct admits as freshman!

** permission to pursue an accelerated degree does not guarantee admission to the master's degree.

Timeline Summary

Year 3

- Student submits internal application/declaration
- If recruited earlier – confirm continued eligibility
- Recorder places in BS/MS Codes (e.g. SPEA1/BSPAMPA1 - Public Affairs BS/MPA)


Year 4

- Student enrolls in both UGRD & GRAD courses
- Student submits graduate application for start term AFTER graduation

Year 5

- Student has been admitted to GRAD career (e.g. SPEA5/BSPAMPA2 – MPA/Public Affairs BS)
- Student completes GRAD plan of study and master's degree requirements

Accelerated Degrees: 4 + 1 model



Accelerated Degrees: Common pitfalls to avoid



Place undergrad student on the accelerated track (BS/MS program/plan code in SIS) BEFORE taking graduate courses in year 4.

- **If undergraduate student is approved to take a graduate course and IS NOT in the BS/MS program in SIS they will appear on a Registrar audit. YIKES!**

Do not admit a student into the GRAD career before they complete their BS/BA!

- If admitted to the graduate program BEFORE the BS is conferred the student suffers:
 - Financial aid issues
 - Discontinued from the GRAD career in SIS if enrolled under UGRD career
 - If enrolled under GRAD career they pay grad-level fees for BOTH graduate and undergraduate courses

Superb student advising by undergraduate advisor and graduate program director/advisor is KEY!

- Close announcement in applicant portal on Oct. 1, 2020
- Officially close on Oct. 30, 2020 to applicants
 - Programs will still be able to process applications in WebAdMIT




IU Graduate CAS: 2021–2022 CAS Cycle Pre-Launch

- Application Portal
 - Winter 21, Spring 22, Summer 22, Fall 22 admit term
- WebAdMIT Configuration Portal
 - Opens earlier November and closes end of January
 - October 26th – applications (Q4s) will rollover from 20 – 21 to Pre-launch portal.
 - Your chance to make edits based on lessons learned in the last year.

Required for any change to a domestic student's academic records **AFTER final admit** (deferral, term activation, final transcript)

Fellowships and Funding

- University Fellowships (1 year stipend, health insurance, and travel funds)
 - Call for applications in January - deadline February 12th, 2021
 - Online coversheet and upload
 - 10 month option & 12 month option (PhD 10 month - \$19,000 and 12 month - \$22,500; Master's 10 month - \$11,000 and 12 month \$12,000)
- Travel Fellowships (Up to \$1000)
 - Fall deadline (October 16, 2020) & Spring deadline (March 12, 2021)
 - If awarded the Graduate Office reimburses the department after travel
 - Students will receive instructions in their award email that provides the link needed to claim reimbursement for the school
 - New travel date ranges to accommodate students and Conference Acceptance notices, virtual conferences allowed (if 1st author on paper/poster)
- Diversity Fellowships
 - The Adam W. Herbert Graduate Fellowship (4 year award – February deadline) – IU only
 - President's Graduate Diversity Recruitment Award (2 year award – February 12, 2021)
 - IUPUI Diversity Recruitment Fellowship (1 year award – February 12, 2021)
 - President's Diversity Dissertation Award (must have Candidacy approved – April 16, 2021)
- Block Grant Funds
 - Call for applications November
 - Deadline is December 11th, 2020
